<p>Pre-Initiation Reporting and Fees</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pre-initiation fee is \$70 per associate member, (plus \$15 <i>The White Diamond</i>, \$10 associate member pin (optional) budget for \$95 total) Update Chapter Gateway and pay fees within 3 days of ceremony Ensure associate members claim their accounts within 24 hours by following the instructions in the automated email they receive <p>Initiation Reporting, Cards and Fees</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Order gold and white cards via Pi Kappa Phi Supplies Initiation fee is \$195 per member, plus \$20 member badge (required); budget for \$215 total Update Chapter Gateway, mail white copies of initiation cards to National Headquarters and pay fee within 3 days of Ritual <p>Green Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Due February 10 and September 10 Archon and secretary have access to complete via Chapter Gateway <p>Member Dues</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Billed twice per year; budget \$85 per member for spring 2026 and \$86 per member for fall 2026 (\$171 annually) Due 30 days after billing; roughly March 15 and October 30 <p>Housing Investment Fund (HIF)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Billed twice per year; \$10 per member per semester (\$20 annually) Due 30 days after billing; roughly March 15 and October 30 <p>Risk Management and Insurance Assessment</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Covers general liability insurance, Member Accident Protection Program (MAPP), risk management administration and prevention education programs; \$300 per member for 2025-2026 New Member Insurance: \$100 per associate member initiated; billed at the time of initiation and due 30 days after billing. Fall new initiate insurance billed in February; due March 15; \$150 per fall 2025 new member 2026-2027 Billing: billed in April; roster changes due May 21; due September 21 (10% discount if paid by May 21) <p>Associate Member Education Program Dates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Submit program details on Chapter Gateway no later than 7 days prior to the first Pre-Initiation Ceremony A video tutorial is available on the Virtual Journey through the Pi Kapp Hub <p>Founders' Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete and submit the Founders' Report on Chapter Gateway by April 15 (spring) and November 1 (fall) <p>Officer Election Report</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Archon and secretary have access to complete via Chapter Gateway Officer updates must be submitted by December 1 and upon any other officer changes <p>IRS Form 990</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Must be submitted to the IRS and director of chapter services annually in order to maintain the chapter's tax-exempt status Due to the IRS on the 15th day of the fifth month after chapter's fiscal year end (e.g., if your fiscal year ends on June 30, your 990 must be filed by November 15) Resources available on the Virtual Journey through the Pi Kapp Hub <p>Brotherhood Survey</p> <p>In partnership with the Piazza Center, Pi Kappa Phi's Brotherhood Survey is distributed in the fall (to all initiated undergraduate members) and spring (to all newly-initiated members who joined in the previous fall). This data matters because it tells a story about the member experience and highlights what your chapter is doing well and where growth is needed to strengthen brotherhood, improve performance and align more closely with Pi Kappa Phi's mission. Participation by all undergraduate members is expected.</p>	<p>Pi Kapp College for Chapter Officers</p> <p>Pi Kapp College for Chapter Officers is held regionally each January and serves as Pi Kappa Phi's training academy for both chapter officers and key committee chairmen. The registration fee for 2027 is \$2,600 and a minimum of 8 delegates must attend. Additional delegates are welcome to attend at an additional cost. For more information, visit pikapp.org. Your chapter's officer listing must be updated via Chapter Gateway by December 1, 2026, and the deadline to pay for Pi Kapp College for Chapter Officers is December 10, 2026. All payments made after this date will be considered late, and an additional fee of \$100 will be due. All officers attending must register by December 15.</p> <p>Pi Kapp College: Treasurers' Academy</p> <p>Pi Kapp College: Treasurer's Academy is a summer program for treasurers to learn the skills necessary to develop, manage and execute a chapter budget. This four-day program will serve as an opportunity for chapter officers to further their leadership experience and support their chapter. Taking place in early June and required for all chapters, registration (with the exception of the cost of travel) is covered by a grant from the Pi Kappa Phi Foundation.</p> <p>Ladder of Risk</p> <p>Ladder of Risk is a two-hour program that educates chapter members on the basics of the Pi Kappa Phi Risk Management Policy and creates a conversation about planning safe social events. Trained facilitators deliver Ladder of Risk to approximately 40 chapters each year.</p> <p>Alcohol Skills Training Program (ASTP)</p> <p>ASTP is a two-hour program that educates chapter members about alcohol-related behavior while increasing their interest in critically examining personal drinking patterns and eventually implementing the skills they learn. Trained facilitators deliver ASTP to approximately 40 chapters each year.</p> <p>Ultimate Respect in Action</p> <p>A two-hour program that educates chapter members on how to create a culture that exemplifies Ultimate Respect — a chapter where all people are treated with dignity and respect and brothers are equipped with the skills needed to intervene effectively when members violate established expectations. Trained facilitators deliver Ultimate Respect in Action to approximately 40 chapters each year.</p> <p>Health & Safety Edu</p> <p>Health & Safety Edu is an interactive program that focuses on alcohol consumption, hazing prevention, bystander intervention, sexual assault awareness, equity, inclusion, diversity and the fraternity's Risk Management policy. The goal of this program is to provide members the skills to make safer and healthier decisions.</p> <p>Associate members should complete the modules prior to their initiation date. The fine deadline for associate members who do not complete the modules is June 1, 2026, for spring 2026 associate members and December 1, 2026, for fall 2026 associate members.</p> <p>Behind Happy Faces</p> <p>Behind Happy Faces is a program that strives to engage students in positive conversation with one another on the topic of mental health. Through the program, students gain a baseline understanding of mental health, reflect on their mental health, identify effective and ineffective coping mechanisms and learn how to support others throughout their mental health journey. Trained facilitators deliver the program to approximately 40 chapter each year.</p> <p>Chapter Operating Expectations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expectations of all chartered chapters outlined in Supreme Law VIII in the Gold Book Compliance assessed by December 31 and June 30; reported to chapters at the beginning of the following semester Chapters not in compliance for two consecutive semesters may be referred to the National Council for further action
